

FROM THE 18 JANUARY, FEAST OF THE CHAIR OF ST. PETER IN ROME, TO 25 JANUARY, FEAST OF THE CONVERSION OF ST PAUL

Officially started in 1908, this initiative had the approval of Pius X and Benedict XV not as a common prayer with other Christians, but as a prayer of Catholics 'for the return of dissidents to Rome'. Blessed Maria Gabriella Sagheddu, a Trappist nun who died at the age of 25, offered her life for Christian unity.

- 18 January: for the conversion of all those in error
- 19 January: for the recomposition of all schisms and the return

of the Orthodox and Eastern Churches under papal authority

- 20 January: for the conversion of the Lutherans and Protestants of Europe
- 21 January: for the conversion of the Anglicans
- 22 January: for the conversion of the Protestants of America
- 23 January: for the conversion of lapsed Catholics
- 24 January: for the conversion of Jews
- 25 January: for the conversion of Muslims and the faithful of other religions
